In our Leyland Home we have Sister Dorothy Brace who was born in Middlesbrough, Yorkshire in December 1910. She comes from a large family of five sisters and one brother.

The family came into the Truth in the early 1920's and soon moved from Yorkshire to Lewisham, London so that they could begin attending meetings at the London Tabernacle.

Dorothy, a teenager at the time, remembers standing on the edge of the pavement on Saturdays offering the Watchtower and Golden Age magazines to those walking by.

The family later moved to Ramsgate, Kent where Dorothy and one of her sisters became colporteurs and were given a map of the county of Surrey to work. They set off on bicycles with their suitcases on the back and cartons of literature on the front and arrived in Chertsey where they first had to find somewhere to stay. The next two years were spent discussing the Bible with people and placing

books and booklets.

In 1935 Dorothy married William Brace, a Grammar School teacher, and went to live in Pontypool in Wales.

Dorothy was still very active in the ministry using the Transcription Machine to play the records in the Welsh villages and also involved in the Information Marches in London. She vividly remembers carrying the boards which had 'Religion is a snare and a racket'

on the front and 'Serve God and Christ the King' on the back.

During World War II William and Dorothy served as pioneers in both Coventry and Leicester and then Spalding in Lincolnshire. Both were imprisoned for their stand on neutrality.

After the war they moved to Mexborough in Yorkshire. Then later they were invited to live in America for a year. It was there in Denver, Colorado that Dorothy became pregnant and on returning to England in 1951 gave birth to her son, Tony.

Sadly Dorothy's husband died in 1997. Dorothy continues faithfully serving Jehovah and looks forward to the time when God's Kingdom with all its blessings, which she has proclaimed for decades, will become a reality.
