

In the Home at Maryport we have Brother Hans Sturm who was brought up part of a sailing family in Germany. In fact he has sailed across the Atlantic in four-masted steel vessels and on one voyage he sailed around the world on a steamship.

In 1933, he attended navigation college to qualify as a ships mate



but was expelled because of refusing to say "Heil Hitler". Because of his neutral stand he was blacklisted and was thus unable to sail on any ship or get any employment.

Later, Brother Sturm travelled to England where he was baptised in Liverpool in 1937. However, in June 1940 he was arrested as an enemy alien and sent to Canada. After the war he was released from detention and returned to England where he married Olive.

In 1952, he was able to join his wife in the full time pioneer ministry helping many people along into the Truth. Sadly, his wife died in 1997.
